What this report is

An AI first read of the questionnaire, followed by an expert review by Milos Kankaras. The AI pass is a blind critique lane: it reads only the item text, construct label, keying and response format, and returns for each item a call (keep, revise or cut), a rejection-risk rating, a predicted endorsement-extremity rating and a critique of at most twenty words. The reviewer reads every item; the AI pass tells him where to read hardest.

On the OECD SSES 2018 item trial (332 items, 140 dropped by the real expert review), the same lane's revise-or-cut calls agreed with the review's drop decisions at OR 2.78 (95 percent CI 1.76 to 4.40), AUC 0.67, sensitivity 0.52 at specificity 0.72; 16 of its 23 cut calls were items the review dropped. Recorded 2026-09-11 in AdriaMont's calibration record, available on request.

One row per item. The call, risk (1 to 5) and critique are the AI pass; the suggested rewrite is a separate drafting pass and is a starting point for the reviewer, not a decision. Items the AI pass called keep are listed in the annex with their ratings.

Format notes

Mechanical observations from a wording lint: word count, reading level, conjunctions, negations, absolutes, and review prompts for group-loaded or locale-specific content. These are notes, not verdicts. They carry no weight in any call above; the lint's own verdict is not used in this product.

Provenance

Each item was compared with the item texts of 699 catalogued instruments held locally. A hit names the instrument, its licence class and its citation; no catalogued item is quoted. Licence class is a research judgement, not legal advice.

Limitations

It does not predict item statistics. On 162 published adult self-report items its flags were unrelated to empirical item weakness (OR 1.25, 95 percent CI 0.61 to 2.58).

It does not simulate respondents and does not predict a response distribution.

It does not replace a pilot, cognitive interviews or a psychometric analysis of real responses.

The format notes are mechanical observations about wording (length, reading level, conjunctions, negations, absolutes, review prompts). They are notes, not verdicts, and carry no weight in any call.

The provenance check reports resemblance to catalogued instruments by name, licence class and citation. It quotes no catalogued item and is not a legal opinion.

The translation-risk notes are prompts for the translator, not a translation and not a guarantee of equivalence.

The full calibration record for the AI pass is available on request.
